



School Sport Premium Funding

For the academic year 2014 – 15, Hunslet Carr received **£9,515** in Sport Premium funding. The expenditure for this funding allocation was as follows:

Service Level Agreement - £1,000

The school signed up to the Leeds Active Schools service level agreement. This enabled the school to access professional advice and support on how to take the school forward in Sport & Physical Education. It also provided us with access to school sport competitions and events such as the Rugby World Cup Participation Event, and SKY Sports Living for Sport.

Teaching Resources - £1,104.94

We had identified that we needed to refresh some of the resources in school to ensure that Physical Education lessons and extra-curricular clubs could be delivered to the highest possible standard. Some new resources were also purchased to enable us to host regular football matches against other schools.

Coaching - £4,650

As a school we identified gymnastics as a key area for development as an extra-curricular activity. Following consultation with parents and children, we realised the high demand for the sport and therefore decided to put in place clubs for the whole school to access. We used a company recommended by British Gymnastics as the coaches' work at international level. We also identified that we needed to increase activity levels of the children who do not attend after school clubs, therefore we employed Premier Sports to run lunchtime clubs.

Kit - £2,297.37

In order to raise the profile of sports teams in school and to promote the importance of kit being worn across school, we heavily invested in new kits to be worn by all school sports teams



at competitions and matches. It made our children recognisable and gave them an identity when they were representing school. We also bought a variety of spare school PE kits in order to prevent kit being a barrier to participation in PE lessons for those children who forgot their kit or didn't have their own. Staff were also bought polo shirts to wear when teaching PE lessons to continue to model the importance of PE kit and set the expectations for kit.

CPD - £485

Following advice for experienced practitioners and assessing the quality of delivery of Physical Education in school, we decided to send one member of staff on a training course for a new PE initiative that we intend to run throughout the school. The training enabled the PE subject leader to gain a greater understanding of real PE and how suitable it was for our school before committing to the whole programme.

Total spend for 2014-15 - £9,537.31
