



For the financial year 2015 – 16, Hunslet Carr will receive **£9515** in Sport Premium. The planned expenditure for this funding allocation is as follows:

Service Level Agreement - £1,000

The school will continue to sign up to the Active Schools service level agreement. It will allow us to continue to access professional advice and support to further develop the provision we provide for Physical Education, school sport and physical activity. The SLA allows us to access CPD and a wide range of school sport competitions and events.

Teaching Resources - £2,500

As we are purchasing a new scheme of work, we will need to ensure that our teaching resources are up to date, to allow the effective teaching of Physical Education. We have also identified that we need to replace the gymnastics mats in order to ensure that they meet the correct health and safety standards.

Coaching - £1,000

After the sustained success of employing a gymnastics coach, we will be continuing to use the funding to pay for specialist after school gymnastics clubs. Clubs continue to be fully subscribed and will be offered to children in all year groups, of all abilities.

Kit - £500

To continue to promote the importance of PE kit, we will be purchasing polo shirts for members of staff new to the school to ensure that they are modelling correct kit in PE lessons. Money will be used to purchase spare PE kit for children, to ensure that they can safely and hygienically participate in PE lessons.



CPD - £2,320

We will be purchasing and implementing a new scheme of work for Physical Education called Real PE. Through researching and exploring many options, it was clear that Real PE would be the best possible tool to ensure high quality, sustainable PE lessons that will develop individual children as a whole.

The scheme will provide a framework for staff to ensure that children become physically literate, as well as supporting their social and emotional skills, cognitive skills, creative skills and knowledge of a healthy lifestyle. We recognised that the scheme focuses on skills that the children can use in the classroom and in life.

All staff will receive a full day training session to improve confidence and competence in teaching PE.

The subject leader will attend an additional training day in order to improve expertise in assessment and therefore support teachers.

To complement the Real PE scheme, we will send a member of staff on a Real Gym training day to investigate how it can improve gymnastics teaching in Physical Education.

Staff - £1,000

To ensure that children are able to access a wide range of competitive sporting events after school, we will employ a member of staff to drive to all events.

Equipment - £1000

New equipment will need to be purchased to replenish stocks and to complement the new scheme of work to allow lessons to run effectively.

Total spend for 2015-16 - £9,320.00
